Environment and Planning D: Society and Space accepts original manuscripts of between 7000 and 10000 words, including abstract, all tables, figures and references. Figures account for 250 -500 words, depending on size.

Topic and Book Forum Guidelines

Society & Space welcomes timely, curated collections of short essays organized around a theme or engaging with a recently published book. These are distinct from Special Issues - Forum pieces are shorter and more narrative than typical research articles. We aim to publish three or four forums per year and review proposals on a rolling basis.

Coordinates: Orientations in the socio-spatial landscape

Our new *Coordinates* section features topical forums comprised of 5 to 8 short essays (2,000–4,000 words each) and a framing introduction written by the Guest Editor (proposer).

The proposal must be submitted by the proposed Guest Editor as a single PDF to the ***Coordinates*** Editor, Naama Blatman, via email: n.blatman@unsw.edu.a. Your proposal must include:

- Rationale (One-Page): A document detailing how the forum topic addresses the journal's core themes of consequential theory and geography. This description must clearly articulate how the forum will engage with and elucidate concepts, arguments, and insights on timely matters of interest to *Society & Space* readers.
- Contributors: A list of contributors who have already agreed to write essays.

If the proposal is accepted, the Guest Editor is responsible for coordinating all contributions and submitting the entire forum to the journal as a complete, final package for review. Every essay in the forum will undergo rigorous editorial review; essays that do not meet the journal's criteria will not be published.

Book Forums invite a series of critical reflections designed to engage the core concepts of a recently published book. Each Forum will include 5-6 reviews, followed by the author's response. Proposals must be submitted by the proposed organizer (the proposer) as a single PDF to the Book Forum Editor, Naama Blatman, via email: n.blatman@unsw.edu.au. Your proposal must include:

- Rationale (One-Page): A document detailing how the selected book addresses the journal's core themes of consequential theory and geography. This description must articulate how the book's concepts, arguments, and empirical work open a space for dialogue and, crucially, why it will be a fertile jumping-off point for a lively and engaging book review forum.
- The names and affiliations of 5 or 6 reviewers who already agreed to provide a review, and a written commitment from the author to provide a response.

Special issues

Society & Space publishes one Special Issue per year. The review process is conducted annually, and only one proposal will be invited to proceed each cycle.

- Deadline: January 15, 2026
- Submission: Combine all materials into a single PDF and email it to the Special Issue editor, Alex Moulton at alex.moulton18@hunter.cuny.edu
- Submissions will be reviewed by EPD editors and proposers will be notified no later than March 1, 2026.

Your proposal must include the following:

1. A summary (1500 words max) of the issue that clearly articulates how it aligns with and advances the journal's Aims and Scope and connects with the specific vision laid out in the current editorial vision of Consequential theory, consequential geography as articulated in our recent [editorial](#).
2. Name and affiliation of guest editors and their prior editorial experience. Titles, author names, author affiliations, and abstracts for all planned papers (no more than nine papers total).

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For clinical trials, the trial registry name and URL, and registration number must be included at the end of the abstract.

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
