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Article types

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JCMS is an English language journal and submissions must be presented in a style and grammar consistent with the highest standards of English publications.

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All accepted manuscripts will be published online ahead of print.

Original Research. Original, in-depth clinical and investigative research manuscripts will be given the highest priority for publication. Preference will be given to research that will enhance the understanding of cutaneous disease or impact the medical and/or surgical practice of dermatology.

Manuscripts should not exceed 3000 words, excluding the abstract, references, tables, and figure legends. The use of small figures, photographs, and tables (a quarter page up to a half page in size, based on a standard US letter paper size, 8.5 x 11 inches) are encouraged if they are not completely redundant with the text and add clarity to the manuscript. All other tables and figures should be submitted as supplementary files.

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Review Articles. These scholarly articles should provide a current, authoritative, referenced discussion of a disease or medical and/or surgical treatment. The purpose of these articles is to inform the practice of dermatology by critically reviewing the current understanding and/or treatment of the condition. Review articles should not include case reports, e.g., “a Case Report and Review of the Literature.” Case Reports should be submitted to JCMS Case Reports at <http://www.sagepub.com/jcmscr>. Review articles may be submitted by authors for publication consideration or solicited by the Editor. All Review articles are subject to peer review.

Manuscripts should not exceed 4500 words, excluding the abstract, references, tables, and figure legends. The use of small figures, photographs, and tables (a quarter page up to a half page in size, based on a standard US letter paper size, 8.5 x 11 inches) are encouraged if they are not completely redundant with the text and add clarity to the manuscript. All other tables and figures should be submitted as supplementary files. The Editors reserve the right to determine if tables and figures should appear within the published article or as supplemental material. Reporting guidelines (e.g., PRISMA, CONSORT, and other Equator Network guidelines) should always be submitted as supplementary files. Please ensure you have selected the “Supplementary File” file designation when uploading these manuscript files in the submission site (not “figure/image” or “table”).

In-Depth Review Articles. These reviews provide a thorough, balanced understanding of an important issue in the field, and provide suggestions for future research. To ensure a balanced perspective, authors must describe their process for identifying and including papers in the review. If there are controversies or inconsistencies in the literature being reviewed, presentation of this information in a balanced approach is required (eg, present both “sides”) and indicate where the balance currently lies. Authors are encouraged to send In-Depth Review proposals to the Editor via email for feedback prior to submission. Portions or all of In-Depth Reviews may be published online-only at the Editor’s discretion.

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Research Letters. Letters, commenting on translational research of importance to the clinical dermatologist.
