

## Outlook on Agriculture

Impact Factor: 2.6

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*Outlook on Agriculture* is a peer reviewed journal, published quarterly, which welcomes perspectives, reviews and original research papers on current developments in agricultural research for development for an international and interdisciplinary readership.

Priority is given to papers which provide **new insights** on approaches to future food production, food security, mitigating and adapting to climate change, the role of

agriculture in social and economic development and agricultural policy. Papers which challenge questionable approaches are especially welcome. Reviews, perspectives and research papers should clearly demonstrate **novel findings which advance knowledge** on the specific topic.

Papers should be in the region of 6-8000 words with a recommended limit of 30 reference citations.

The following papers are outside the scope of *Outlook on Agriculture* and will be desk-rejected without review:

- Corroborative and descriptive studies and reviews;
- Studies of local significance;
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- Applications of Artificial Intelligence and Digital technologies in agriculture;
- Aquaculture and fisheries studies;
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The following papers are outside the scope of *Outlook on Agriculture* and will be desk-rejected without review: corroborative and descriptive studies and reviews; studies of local significance; laboratory-based and controlled environment studies; applications of Artificial Intelligence and Digital technologies in agriculture; aquaculture and fisheries studies; aromatic and medicinal plant studies; surveys with limited sample sizes; and topic-specific bibliometric reviews.

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The text should be ordered under appropriate sub-headings (not numbered paragraphs or sections) and three levels of sub-heading are possible.

The title page should show the names and addresses of the authors, their professional status and affiliation and address (including e-mail) to which correspondence should be sent. As this page will not be sent to referees, the title of the article (without author names) should be repeated on the first text page.

#### **Preferred format for perspective papers:**

**Abstract** The abstract should state the need for the perspective, the principle arguments presented and discussed and the significance of the conclusions and recommendations.

**Remainder of the paper** A flexible format is recommended. Papers should address the topic through debate and discussion of its complexities based on biophysical, institutional, economic, social, and political factors that influence future sustainable food production and security. Priority is given to perspectives that question conventional wisdom through an evidence-based approach, presenting arguments supported by relevant literature. Conclusions should identify gaps in existing knowledge and future research needs.

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**Discussion** The discussion should explore the significance of the results in the context of relevant published papers and highlight the key original findings. Extensive citations and discussion of published literature should be avoided. Confirmation of similar findings in past published papers should be minimal.

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
